**Luke 7:11-16** – This is one of three resurrections performed by our Lord as recorded in the Gospels. They confirm the promise given to the prophet Ezekiel that God will one day open the graves and raise all the dead (Ezekiel 37:1-14). Many people have exercised authority over the living, only the Son of God "has power over both the living and the dead" (funeral service).

While Christ has power through His word alone (John 11:43), here He also **touched** the coffin to show that His very body is life-giving. This event also prefigures Christ's own Resurrection. As Mary would weep for Jesus at the Cross, yet her tears would be turned to joy by the Resurrection, here widow's **only son** is raised from the dead, putting an end to her weeping (St. Ambrose).

**John 17:1-13** – Christ's prayer is often called the High Priestly Prayer, as it contains the basic elements of prayer a priest offers to God when a sacrifice is about to be made; glorification (vv. 3-5), remembrance of God's works (vv. 2, 6-8), intercession on behalf of others (vv. 9, 11), and a declaration of the offering itself (vv. 1, 5)

The hour has come signifies Christ is Lord over time. "He voluntarily willed to ascend the Cross in the flesh" (hymn of Orthodoxy Sunday). Glorify refers to the redemption of all creation that will be accomplished through the Cross and Resurrection – the purpose for which Christ was sent into the world. In this redemption, the Father and the Son are glorified. This is why the Cross, which is a sign of death, is glorified in the Church as "life-giving" and the "weapon of peace."

- **17:3** The knowledge of **the only true God** is far more than intellectual understanding. It is participation in His divine life and in communion with Him. Thus, **eternal life** is an ongoing, loving knowledge of God in Christ and the Holy Spirit.
- **17:4** Christ's **work** can never be separated from who He is. This verse is a statement each believer can make at the end of life, no matter how long or short that life may be.
- **17:6 The men whom You have given Me** are the apostles. They are the ones through whom God's **word** comes to us. This handing down of God's word to successive generations is called apostolic tradition.

Isaiah prophesied that in the days of the Messiah, the knowledge of **the Name of God** would be revealed (Is. 52:6). **Your name:** In the Old Testament times, the phrase "the Name" was reverently used as a substitute for God's actual Name "Yahweh," which was too sacred to pronounce. The fuller revelation of the Name was given to those who believe in Christ, for Christ **manifested** the Name not only by declaring the Father, but by being the very presence of God and sharing the Name with Him.

- **17:9** Christ first prayed for Himself (vv. 1-5) and secondly **for them,** the apostles (vv. 6-13). Only then does He pray **for those whom you have given Me** all who will come to believe in Him. Here **the world** is the portion of humanity in rebellion against God, those who prefer darkness to His light.
- **17:11 Holy Father** is echoed in the Eucharistic prayer of Didache 10:2: "We give you thanks, Holy Father, for **Your** holy **name** which You have made to dwell in our hearts."
- **17:12 The son of perdition** ("destruction") is Judas Iscariot (6:70, 71). Old Testament prophecy alludes to Judas (Psalms 40:10; 108:2-13; Zec. 11:12, 13), and Judas becomes a type for all who will fall away in the last days.

<u>BAPTISMS</u> are scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays at 11 A.M. Two God-parents are required; at least one of whom must be an Orthodox Christian by Faith, and the other a practicing Christian. An infant's first or middle name must be a saint's name.

<u>CHURCH FUNERALS</u> are provided for parishioners who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations to the Parish. Otherwise, burial is from the funeral home. The Church

### POLITICS CANNOT BRING FORTH THE KINGDOM

does not permit cremation.

The gospel demands that Christians usher the Kingdom of God into this world, not by political ideology, but by the individual Christian's transformation of self. This command to usher in the Kingdom of God does not mean we should be neutral in the face of evil; rather it is a recognition that the Church is only the Church when she is there for others. The Church must be immune from any possibility of turning the message of Christ into anything that diminishes focus on the Crucified One, for her glory as the Church is in Christ crucified. St. John Chrysostom said: "If you cannot find Christ in the beggar at the church door, you will not find Him in the chalice."

Orthodoxy is the incarnation of beauty, while political extremism is devoid of poetry and art. Political extremism destroys beauty, while the Church embodies the very essence of beauty. The Church must never surrender to any political ideology, because she must always stand on the side of the weakest and poorest of society. When the Church aligns herself with one camp or another, she is in danger of being absorbed into worldly ideologists that obscure her beatific vision. Neither the democrats nor the socialist nor the monarchical form of government is needed for the Church to thrive, if she is committed to living out her biblical vocation of pointing to Christ Jesus, the Savior and Redeemer of the world.

The manifestation of the Kingdom of God cannot be brought forth into this world by any political movement, nor by force of arms, but by the changing of the hearts of men and women everywhere. Only when Christ is manifest in His people will the Kingdom take root, and peace and justice will reign in this world. The darkness cannot be overcome by any political movement, but only by the introduction of the light of Christ.
