

Luke 19:1-10

19:1 – Jericho was notorious as a place of iniquity and is commonly associated with sinful living. **19:2 – He was rich:** Jesus said, "How hard it is for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God!" This encounter between Christ and Zacchaeus demonstrates that grace can accomplish that which is impossible to man.

19:3, 4 – Many spiritual interpretations express the universal significance of this encounter. St. Theophylact sees the crowd symbolizing sins: "Crowded in by a multitude of passions and

worldly affairs, he is not able to see Jesus." St. Ambrose sees several parallels: (1) Zacchaeus being **short** is indicative of his being short on faith and virtue; (2) that Zacchaeus must ascend a **tree** shows no one attached to earthly matters can see Jesus; and (3) the Lord intending **to pass that way** reveals that Christ will approach anyone willing to repent and believe.

19:8 – Zacchaeus uses the term give for his free and generous offering to the poor, and restore for what he owes those he had cheated, as this was not a gift but required by the Law (Ex.

22:1). By doing both, Zacchaeus not only fulfills the Law, but shows his love of the gospel.

19:9 – The title **son of Abraham** indicates Zacchaeus has become like this patriarch of Israel: he was counted righteous by his faith, he became generous toward the poor, and he was united to the people of God. Early records tell us he went on to be a bishop of the Church.

<u>BAPTISMS</u> are scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays at 11 A.M. Two God-parents are required; at least one of whom must be an Orthodox Christian by Faith, and the other a practicing Christian. An infant's first or middle name must be a saint's name.

<u>CHURCH FUNERALS</u> are provided for parishioners who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations to the Parish. Otherwise, burial is from the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation.

GOD'S GRACE LIFTS US FROM DESPAIR The Morning Offering by Abbot Tryphon

Many people sail through their life thinking happiness is something they have created for themselves. They think good fortune and success in work and play are things they've brought about, either through struggle or by pure luck. And when they experience difficult times or the loss of things that brought them comfort, they despair.

Sometimes it takes the loss of this established order to enlighten our darkened hearts to the reality that only happiness that is of an eternal nature will never be lost. For someone who has been so enlightened, nothing can take away the comfort and security she experiences that are based in faith. God's grace fills her very essence with such peace that nothing – even loss of worldly comforts – can bring about despair.

How can we possibly despair when we know that the God we worship in the Trinity and who has created us and our world is our co-suffering Savior? He has showered us with such an abundance of grace that no hardship that comes our way can detract from the peace and joy we have experienced in our life in Him.

Compared to this grace-filled life, all else is but folly. Grace has liberated us from the temporal nature of earthly happiness and has taken up residence in our hearts, from which springs forth the healing that transforms us. This grace makes us whole, and our sickness disappears as though it had never been.

PREPARATION FOR THE BLESSING OF HOMES, CONTINUING THIS WEEK!

Before the Priest arrives at your home, here are a few reminders on how to prepare:

- + In the main room of the home, usually the kitchen or dining room, have placed on the table a white cloth, a candle and/an Icon or cross. You may place a small container of Holy Water on the table as well. (Note: Father will bring water with him.
- + Turn off TVs, radios, computers, etc. so as to keep focused on the blessing service.
- + Please make sure that pets are heeled or restrained so as not to get underfoot while Father goes through the home.
- + If you have any items to blessed (Icon, Cross, etc.), put them on the table where the blessing
- + When the Priest arrives, have everyone in the home gather around the table where the blessing take place. Participation is important!
- + Invite friends or neighbors to participate and witness the beauty of this holy tradition.
- + If you need to discuss a personal matter with Father, this is the time to do so.

The sanctification of residences will be conducted from Monday to Saturday each week during the afternoon hours 1-5 and the evening hours 7-9. If you have a preference for an afternoon or

evening visit, please notify Fr. Michael. Your priest shall begin blessing the homes of parishioners living in the Homestead, Munhall, and West Mifflin areas, proceeding within the city of Pittsburgh and concluding in outlying areas. Remember, the invitation to the priest to come and bless your home is an invitation to ask for the mercy of God upon the household. The sprinkling of the Holy Water is a sign of God's presence in home as an extension of His Holy House, the Church. It is a time to renew our commitment to God as we begin another year in His mercy and love for mankind.

<u>WHEN DISCARDING PREVIOUSLY BLESSED HOLY WATER...</u> make certain that you do not spill the sanctified liquid down the sink drain. The blessed C2O should poured on the good earth, around plants, shrubs, trees, on the lawn or ground surface.
